



## Which two people here are at greatest risk from H1N1 flu?

(The answer may surprise you.)

Studies indicate that senior adults are at *least* risk from H1N1 flu. In contrast, children and adults under age 25 are at *highest* risk from this new virus. Because H1N1 vaccine supplies will be limited at first, those at highest risk will get the first shots.

The good news is, everyone who wants the H1N1 vaccine will eventually be able to get it. But until it's your turn, be sure to get your seasonal flu shot, as well as a pneumonia shot if you haven't had one.
